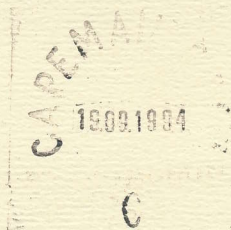
P.S.

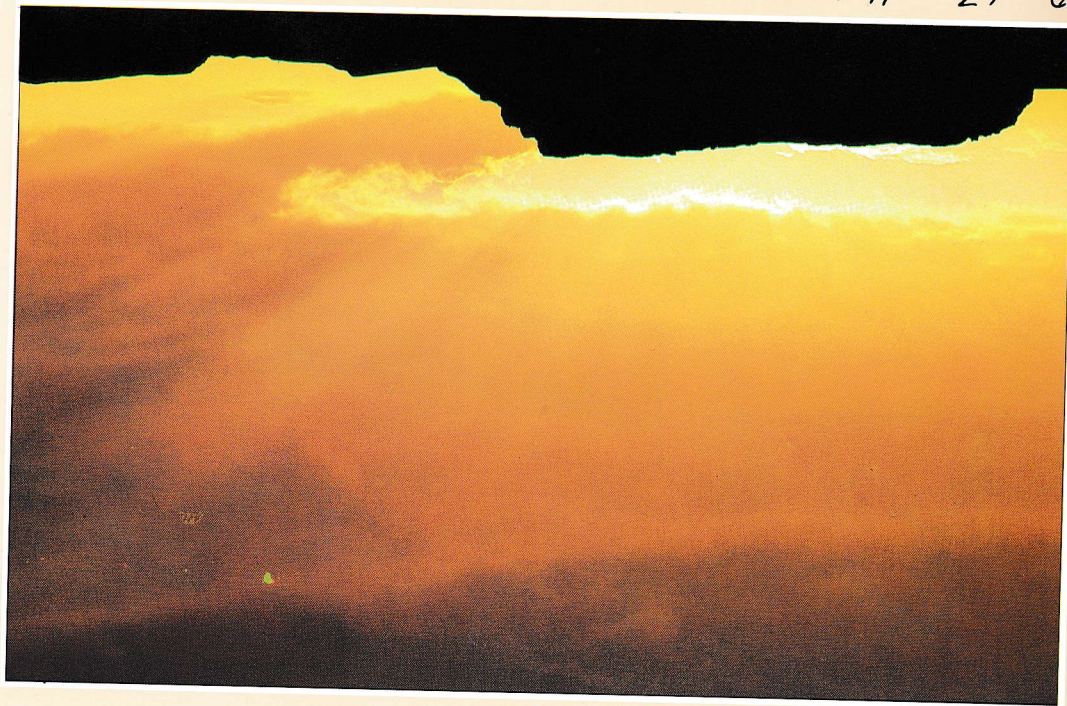
