We discussed the Aims : -

- * That is to strenghten the capacity of Trade Union women.
- * To strenghten there ability to acess the structures.
- * Acess the wealth of info currently available.
- * Lobbying , Advocate and inform Policies & Decision.

Expectations

- @ Be able to handle all situations.
- @ Handling workplace/union discrimination.
- @ Understanding the meaning of Gender.
- @ Building our confidence.
- @ Implementing what we've learnt.
- @ Empowering ourselves.

It was pointed out that we need to look at our own ideas about Gender. Therefore to be sure that we do not pass on our own **fixed** thinking about the differences between male and female. To understand Gender we need to recognise that female as a group have been subordinated to male. Understanding the issue of women **oppressic** better we need to know what the term Gender means.

Gender : - refers to the expectations people have from someone , because that ^{they} are male or female (This means it is socially constructed).

Sex : - is the physical and biological difference between male and female.

Learning that Gender identity is a **learned behaviour** that is opposed to sexual identity. Just as any **learned behaviour** has the potential to change , **gender identity** also has the **potential to change**. To realise this potential the **intiative (first step)** has to come through our **own** awareness and determination to **change**. Male and female will become aware of different form of **oppression** that **effect** them in the various roles they play. gender exposes the **power relations** that exists between male and female. These do get influenced by various other factors such as **class , race , culture tradition , religion etc.**

Also as workers we need to **organise** ourselves in Trade Unions to overcome/fight **class oppression**. This does not mean that women want to rule over man in a **Matriarhical society** , but that they want the **power relations** between male and female to be **equal**. This could happen when we have a society/trade union which practise **democracy** and does not exclude women from any place.

Some interesting info given to us : -

- £ Women make up more than 50% ^{of} the population.
- £ 56.4% of women are estimated to be without an income.
- £ 70% of the Worlds poorest are women.
- £ About 1000 women are raped every day in South Africa.

This course motivated me to change my ways of thinking , acting and to enspire other women on a variety of Gender issues. It is off utmost importance that all women become **LIBERATED !!!!!**
