

Chris McGregor and the Blue Notes to play in *Daily News*

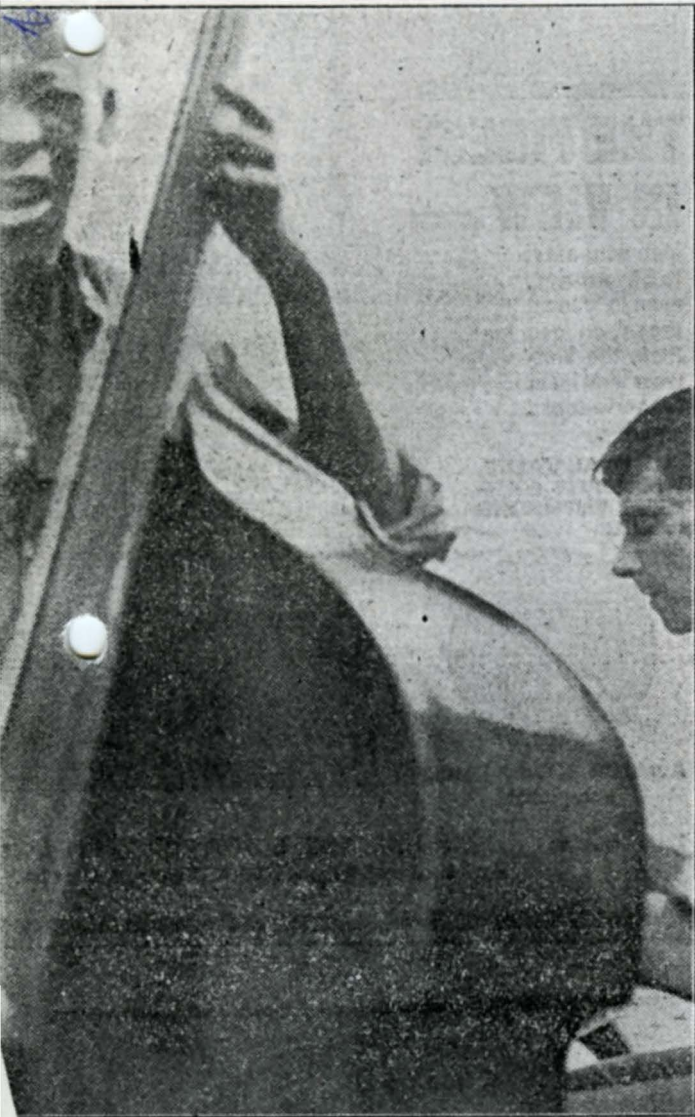

CHRIS McGREGOR and the Blue Notes, South Africa's leading jazz combination, will play in Durban next week, before going to France to participate in the Antibes Jazz Festival.

Their performance at the City Hall on Wednesday will be their first appearance in Durban—and perhaps their last. The band's multi-racial composition (McGregor is the only White musician) makes its existence a precarious one.

McGregor's companions are Johnny Dyani (bass), Louis Moholo (drums), Dudu Pukwana (alto-sax), Nick Moyake (tenor-sax) and Mongezi Feza (trumpet)—all of whom have helped produce an original, South African style of jazz.

Some of Durban's own jazz musicians will take part in the show. Pianist Chris Joseph will lead his quartette of John Joustra (bass), Johnny Purkis (drums) and Ray Hann (alto, flute and bass clarinet).
