

When he eventually appeared there was a large grin all over his face and he told how he just had to stay there and read all the Irish jokes we had on the wall. He laughed as he repeated the last joke of them all, "Why are Irish jokes so simple?" "So that the English can understand them."

I have a feeling that after Bill resigned as Archbishop he had many frustrations but now in The Lord's grace he has perfect knowledge and understands why things were sometimes hard to bear.

On Wednesday Evening we had a Thanksgiving Service for all that God in Jesus through the power of the Holy Spirit has done in the parish and in the life of its people. I was glad that I could give thanks for Bill for he encouraged me to walk and live in the Spirit and for that, God's Holy Name be praised.

May the same Spirit be your comfort as you remember him.
