MESSAGE FROM THE VICE-CHANCELLOR TO RHODES AIESEC REVIEW 1984-85

The tenor of my message must be one of congratulation to Miss Elizabeth Miller and her 1985 executive and committee and to the 1 300 members of AIESEC at Rhodes. To start with it is a remarkable achievement to persuade 40 per cent of our Grahamstown students to join one society, making it the largest at the University.

Apparently not satisfied with this, the society has extended its territory into East London by establishing a branch at our Division there and I believe that initial contacts with local companies have already drawn interest in your student exchange programme.

The Commerce Week in August was again successful and I look back on it as one of those turning points when the public was first warned that car prices were really on the move - up.

I thought it significant that you were able to attract notable speakers and that they felt you provided a sufficient platform from which to make important statements.

Your predecessors are to be congratulated too. Last year's Rhodes vice-president, Mr Terry Roach, is this year's full-time national vice-president, and Vernon Cloete has progressed from president of Rhodes AIESEC in 1984 to East Cape regional president this year, and has been elected national president of AIESEC in 1986.
