How the magic of music saved a man and his wife from a Lion and how Rabbit helped them escape.
2. The Grandmother and the Crocodile
How an old woman made friends with a Crocodile and what happened to her in the end.
3. The Girl who forgot her Hoe
The story of the girl who left her hoe in the valley and had to work for the animals.

Side Two.

1. Tsimbarume, the Hardened Bachelor
The story of the bachelor who became a hunter and found more than he had expected.
2. Rabbit at the Waterhole
The story of a Rabbit who did not look after a waterhole carefully.

These stories, collected, translated and told by Hugh Tracey are already known by a wide audience in Europe and America far beyond their home territory of Rhodesia among the Karanga people.
