MANIFESTO:

This year has seen important moves in the SRC Education portfolio. The establishment of faculty councils under the general auspices of the SRC is in line with a move to provide students with a greater say in course structure and content, as well as problems related to lecturing standards. Clearly the potential of faculty councils and their co-ordinator, the SRC Education committee, is vast and has not yet been fully realised. If elected, as Education Councillor, my aim would be to build on those foundations already laid. Areas include:

1) Familiarising students with the faculty council structure.

- Improving communications between faculty councils on campus and with faculty councils elsewhere.
- 3) Improving continuity from year to year of the faculty council structure.

4) Increasing the Education Committee grant.

- 5) Co-ordinating efforts in specific areas of importance to students e.g. the exam number system.
- 6) Co-ordinating educative projects on more general issues which concern students: Admissions and Subsidies, Education in South Africa, etc.

The SRC clearly has an important role to play in this area, particularly as it has access to crucial decision-making bodies in the University. If elected I will ensure that the SRC's resources are fully at the disposal of student interests in education.


