THE YEAR 1983 HAS BEEN ONE OF SOLID AND CONSTRUCTIVE ACHIEVEMENT FOR US AT RHODES - AND I USE THE BUILDING METAPHOR IN ITS LITERAL SENSE, AS BRICKS AND MORTAR ARE THE TANGIBLE SIGNS OF OUR PROGRESS THIS YEAR.

IN APRIL, THE UNIVERSITY RECEIVED ITS LARGEST EVER SINGLE DONATION -HALF A MILLION RANDS FROM THE GOLD FIELDS FOUNDATION, SUFFICIENT TO FOR PAY HALF THE COSTS OF A NEW RESIDENCE TO ACCOMMODATE 78 STUDENTS. RESIDENCE IS NAMED GOLD FIELDS HOUSE, AND WILL BE OPENED IN JULY NEXT YEAR.

THE END OF 1983 ALSO MARKS THE FINAL STAGE OF OUR BIGGEST EVER BUILDING PROGRAMME, THE QUAD II PROJECT. CONSTRUCTION WORK IS

VIRTUALLY COMPLETE, AND WILL HAVE COST NEARLY R4 MILLION. THE ENGLISH DEPARTMENT MOVED INTO ITS SPLENDID QUARTERS IN SEPTEMBER, AND GEOLOGY AND GEOGRAPHY WILL BE MOVING DURING THE CURRENT VACATION.

OTHER BUILDING OPERATIONS HAVE INCLUDED TWO RESIDENCE ANNEXES PROVIDING ACCOMMODATION FOR 33 STUDENTS AT A COST OF  $R^{1}4$  MILLION. A Similar sum has been spent FURTHER RI4 MILLION HAS BEEN USED TO BUILD EIGHT DOUBLE STORY MAISONETTES FOR MARRIED POSTGRADUATE STUDENTS.

in augmated A POTENTIALLY INVALUABLE PROJECT WHICH WAS ALSO FINALIZED THIS YEAR IS THE FISH HATCHERY AND FISH FARM, A JOINT PROJECT OF THE UNIVERSITY AND THE JLB SMITH INSTITUTE OF ICHTHYOLOGY. RHODES IS THE ONLY UNIVERSITY IN SOUTHERN AFRICA OFFERING POSTGRADUATE COURSES IN THIS FIELD, AND IT

IS HOPED THAT THE TRAINING AVAILABLE HERE IN AQUACULTURE WILL LEAD TO THE ALLEVIATION OF PROTEIN DEFICIENCIES IN THE RURAL HOMELANDS.

PERHAPS THE MOST REWARDING DEVELOPMENT OF ALL HAS BEEN THE COMING INTO BEING, AFTER FIVE YEARS OF NEGOTIATION, OF A HOME OWNERSHIP SCHEME FOR OUR BLACK WORKERS. THE SCHEME, WHICH WAS WORKED OUT IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE SA PERMANENT BUILDING SOCIETY, OFFERS HOME LOANS ON EXACTLY THE SAME CONDITIONS AS FOR WHITES. IT IS THE FIRST SUCH SCHEME FOR UNIVERSITY STAFF IN SOUTH AFRICA, AND A RECENT VISIT TO THE SITE WITH SOME OF THE PROUD OWNERS BROUGHT HOME TO ME WHAT A MAJOR STEP THIS HAS BEEN IN CONTRIBUTING TO THE NORMALIZATION OF OUR SOCIETY.
